What are hookworms?	<ul> <li>Hookworms are tiny parasitic w live inside the guts of dogs.</li> <li>They have sharp teeth.</li> </ul>	orms that
How do hookworms make dogs sick?	<ul> <li>They bite the insides of the dogs and make them bleed.</li> <li>Dogs with hookworms have bloody guna, pale gums, and are often skinny but have round pot bellies</li> </ul>	
How do hookworms make people sick?		
<ul> <li>Skin rash – Cutaneous larval migrans</li> <li>Young worms on the ground can get into people's skin.</li> <li>They burrow around in the skin. The red lines in the photo are the tracks of the worm.</li> <li>Cases like this are mostly seen in white people working in communities. These people did not make antibodies to dog hookworm when they were younger.</li> <li>Most people who were raised in communities will have antibodies to dog hookworm.</li> <li>These antibodies stop the hookworm</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Gut pain – eosinophilic enteritis</li> <li>Not very much is known about this sickness.</li> <li>It was first discovered by doctors working in Townsville.</li> <li>So far this sickness has only been seen in non-Indigenous people.</li> <li>We do not know enough about it to know if it is a problem for Indigenous people.</li> </ul>
