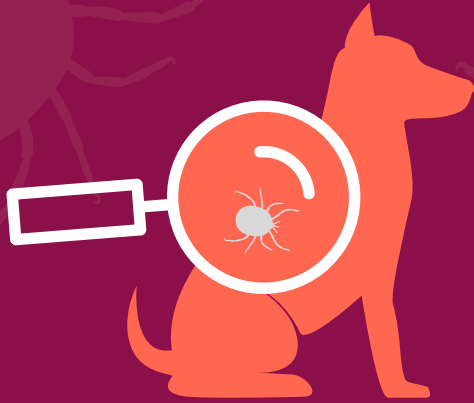


Ehrlichiosis Poster 2– Tick Sickness
